St Joseph In Scripture


"JOSEPH, SON OF DAVID, DO NOT FEAR TO TAKE MARY AS YOUR WIFE, FOR THAT WHICH IS CONCEIVED IN HER IS FROM THE HOLY SPIRIT. SHE WILL BEAR A SON, AND YOU SHALL CALL HIS NAME JESUS, FOR HE WILL SAVE HIS PEOPLE FROM THEIR SINS."

Matthew 1:20-21

In the genealogy of Jesus, Joseph is mentioned as Mary's husband and father of Jesus. (Matthew 1:16).

Joseph is described as a just and righteous man in the Bible. He is obedient to what God asks him to do, in marrying Mary, naming Jesus and watching over him as a loving foster father (Matthew 1:18-25).

Joseph is the patron saint of fathers and a great role model for adoptive parents and foster carers.



The last mention of Joseph in the Gospels is when Jesus went missing in Jerusalem when he was 12 (Luke 2:41-52).

The Bible reveals how Mary and Joseph were naturally worried and then relieved when they found Jesus teaching in the Temple; a reminder to them of how unique their parenting situation was and of what lay ahead in the future.

Joseph worked as a carpenter (Matthew 13:55) and he may

have had his own
business employing
and training others,
including Jesus.
He is the patron
saint of carpenters
and workers.

Joseph listened to the angel's warning in his dream and travelled with his family to Egypt, to keep Jesus safe (Matthew 2:13-23).

Joseph is also the patron saint of travellers because of this dangerous episode.
